


STATUTORY DECLARATION

I, JAMES EDWARD PROSSER-FENN of 68 Street, Orange in the State of New South Wales, Solicitor, do solemnly and sincerely declare as follows:-

1. I have been a partner in the Firm of Baldock Stacy & Niven since 1980 and my Firm has traded at 68 Summer Street, Orange since 1981. I have worked from 68 Summer St Orange for the whole time since 1981 to date.
2. My firm purchased the building in 1979 when it was a disused private hospital and refurbished the bottom two floors for use as a legal office.
3. The building at 68 Summer St consists of three floors the top floor of which is a residence.
4. My office is on the lower floor of the building.
5. To my knowledge and in the time that I have worked at and occupied the building at 68 Summer Street Orange the upper floor of the premises has always been a residence and never used as solicitors offices.
6. I recall being told when we were buying the building that when the building was a private hospital the top floor of the building was used as a nurse's quarters. It contains a kitchen and four bedrooms as well as a lounge, bathroom and laundry.
7. I have never seen any trestle tables in any of the offices of Baldock Stacy Niven at 68 Summer St Orange on the ground floor or the first floor.
8. In early 1999 I showed Steven Edward, a solicitor from Victoria upstairs to the residence where he was to meet Glenn Thompson. Steven came to meet me in my office downstairs and I took him up the internal stairs in the building which consist of a very narrow flight of stairs from the second floor to the back door of the upstairs residence. On the way up I turned to him and said, "Glenn Thompson lives up here above the office, it is the old nurses quarters". I recall that Steven nodded and smiled at the time that I

make this statement to him. I then knocked on the door to the upstairs residence and Glenn Thompson opened it and I introduced Steven to him and then went back downstairs to my office. I had no further contact with Steven at that time.


9. In the days to and shortly after I showed Steven Edward up to Glenn Thompson's residence I had been in Glenn Thompson's residence and it was and is unquestionably a residential premises with a kitchen having, adjacent to it, a dining table consisting of a trestle table as well as a number of trestle tables piled with documents. Glenn had a room with computers in it and the other rooms were bedrooms and a lounge room as well as a laundry bathroom and toilet. To my mind it would be impossible to confuse this collection of rooms and furniture with a legal office.
10. To my recollection, at no time did Steven Edwards photocopy documents belonging to Glenn Thompson in my firm's offices on the first or second floors of 68 Summer St, Orange.

And I hereby make this solemn declaration conscientiously believing the same to be true by virtue of the Oaths Act, 1900.
