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| SUBJECT: | THOMPSON Glen, action taken r land in Edgecombe Road, Kynet 1984. | |
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Situation

- 1. Some time in October 1984, I became aware that a Mr. Glen THOMPSON was selling property in Edgecombe Road, Kyneton and he had reported to the Kyneton Police Station and asked Police to keep a watch on his property as the For Sale signs were being tampered with. Feriodical checks were made of the property however no persons were detected on the property tampering with the signs.
- 2. At about 2.20pm on Sunday the 28th of October 1984, I was on duty at the Kyneton Police Station when two men who I now know to be Glen THONPSCN of 4 James Street, Whittlesea and Kevin SHEPHERD of Kyneton attended at the Police Station. The two men informed me that Mr. THOMPSON was the owner of land in Edgecombe Road, Kyneton which adjoined land owned by the Woodleigh Heights. They reported that some person had pulled down the Sale sign and removed the lot number signs from the ground.
- Both Senior Constable ACKROYD, 20462 and myself attended at Edgecombe Road, Kyneton with both men. I inspected the land owned by Mr. THOMPSON and it was evident that some person had laid down the sale sign so it could not be visible from the Road. Also that lot signs had been removed from the land. No mention was made to me regarding an incident with the Woodleigh Heights Fire Truck. I was informed by both men that they suspected that employees from the Woodleigh Heights Estate were the persons responsible for removing the signs however there was no proof as no person had been seen doing the acts.
- 4. During the conversation I had with Mr THOMPSON at his property he informed me that he did not want to take the matter any further and asked if I could inform the people from Woodleigh Heights that the matter had been reported to Police. All Mr. THOMPSON wanted was to be rid of the land.

Conclusion

- At about 2.45pm on the same day I attended at Woodleigh Heights where I had a conversation with a person Who I now know to be the Sue STOKES, the Manageress of Woodleigh Heights Estate. I informed her of the complaint and allegations and it would be in the interests of all concerned if the signs remained on the property visible to the road. No other action was taken by Police at this station to my knowledge.
- 6. To my knowledge Mr. THOMPSON had no further problems with the Sale Signs on his property. I was not aware of any further problems until I received the attached correspondence.
